

## Assignment of Questions to smartmap Dimensions

### Smartmap Methodology:

- The code “1” indicates that answering a question with “yes” will move the answering voter, candidate or party towards the “right” position on the first dimension or towards the “liberal” position on the second dimension of the smartmap.
- The code “-1” indicates that answering a question with “no” will move the answering voter, candidate or party towards the “right” position on the first dimension or towards the “liberal” position on the second dimension of the smartmap.
- The code “0” indicates that the specific question is not assigned to neither of the two dimensions.
