



Assignment of Questions to smartspider Axes

smartspider Methodology:

The smartspider graph consists of six axes each representing a specific policy or a political goal. Questions can be assigned to none, one or several axes. The code "1" indicates that answering a question with "yes" will move the answering voter, candidate or party towards the goal on the specific axis (moving towards the edge) – a "no" answer will subsequently move the position in these cases in the opposite direction (towards the centre).

The code "-1" indicates a situation vice versa: The "no" answer will stand for a movement towards the specific political goal (moving outwards) and the "yes" answer will lead to a movement towards the centre on the axis.

The code "0" indicates that the specific question is not assigned to an axis.
